# Fulbright Research Grants to France: Grand Est

Open to all levels of scholars with a Ph.D. (or other terminal degree) interested in conducting research in the Grand Est region in an area of specialization.

ELIGIBLE FIELDS	The region welcomes candidates in all disciplines, particularly in the fields in which the region is especially strong: new generation materials and technologies (advanced manufacturing, machines and equipment), bio-economy and bio-refinery, health tech (biotechnology, e-health, health materials, silver economy), sustainable buildings, sustainable transportation systems, water technologies, IT solutions (cybersecurity, smart cities and agriculture), clean and renewable energy (photovoltaic, wind, hydrogen, methanization), and manufacturing (forging, casting, wood construction).
NUMBER OF AWARDS	2-4
LENGTH OF AWARDS	3-12 months
BENEFITS (MAINTENANCE AND TRAVEL)	€2,800 per month. All research scholars also receive a travel allowance of €1,200.
HOW TO APPLY	The American applicant directly submits an application to the Institute of International Education (IIE) once he or she has obtained the support of a French host institution. ABOUT GRAND EST	The new Grand Est region (made up of the former regions of Alsace, Champagne-Ardenne, and Lorraine) has a strategic position in the heart of Europe, sharing a border with four countries (Belgium, Luxembourg, Germany and Switzerland). It is home to five universities, 35 engineering schools, six competitiveness clusters and a significant number of research centers. Its largest cities are Strasbourg, Mulhouse, Reims, Metz, Nancy, Troyes, and Châlons-en-Champagne.
FRENCH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY	French language proficiency sufficient to complete the research project is required. When applicable, applicants should submit Part One (self-evaluation) of the Language Proficiency Report. Applicants who intend to improve their French language skills are preferred.
